 - C:** One note, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open.
 - C#/Db:** Two notes, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open (sharp); 5 holes closed, 4 hole open (flat).
- Staff 3:**
 - D:** One note, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open, with a '+' sign below the 4 hole.
 - D#/Eb:** Two notes, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open (sharp); 5 holes closed, 4 hole open (flat), with '+' signs below the 4 holes.
 - E:** One note, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open, with a '+' sign below the 4 hole.
 - F:** One note, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open, with a '+' sign below the 4 hole.
 - F#/Gb:** Two notes, fingering: 5 holes closed, 4 hole open (sharp); 5 holes closed, 4 hole open (flat), with '+' signs below the 4 holes.
